

India to rewrite drug-quality rulebook to match US, UE, Japan standards



To be released shortly, these legally-enforceable standards, known as Indian Pharmacopoeia (IP) Monographs, are detailed blueprints outlining a drug's identity, purity, and strength. They were last updated in 2022. (MInt)
